IT IS ORDERED that;

- 1. Permission to appeal is refused in relation to Points 1 and 2 of the Grounds of Appeal.
- Permission to appeal is granted in relation to the Tribunal's treatment of Ofcom's second competition concern, as referred to in Point 3 of the Grounds of Appeal.



- 3. BT has permission to amend its Grounds of Appeal and Skeleton Argument if so advised, in relation to the issue for which permission to appeal has been granted, relating to the Tribunal's treatment of Ofcom's second competition concern.
- 4. The appeal be listed for a two-day hearing before a panel of three Court of Appeal judges, one Lord or Lady Justice to have competition experience if possible.
- 5. The Tribunal's suspension of its directions in paragraph 3 and 4(c) of its
 Order of 6 March 2013, and continued by paragraph 3 of the Order of
 Lord Justice Patten of 26 March 2013, be continued until determination of
 the substantive appeal or further order. Liberty to Sky to apply to
 discharge it.
- 6. The case is not suitable for expedition.
